1. Social Research: Advance Research –

Individualized Courses:

The Major Advisor, in consultation with the Student, will design 32 units of courses leading up to, and including, the writing of the dissertation. The courses focus on studies in the specialization and supporting disciplines, chosen by the student. They can be taken at any accredited educational institution, or as tutorial from an approved and qualified faculty member who has a specialization/training on the course. In either case, a Course Outline must be submitted and approved before enrolling in each course. At least thirty units of the total required units for the program should be taken at PMI.
